First stop: The Original Coors Brewery

Whether you are a beer drinker or not, this tour is fascinating, but if it's not your cup of tea, stay on the bus and continue on for more time in Golden.

The Coors Brewery in Golden, CO is the largest single-site brewery in the world. It still stands on the same ground where Mr. Coors set up shop in 1873. On the Coors Brewery Tour get an up-close look at what goes on inside the brewery. The 30-minute tour highlights the malting, brewing and packaging processes before finishing off with a cold sample fresh from the tap (must be 21 years of age or older with a valid ID to sample). Time will be allotted for shopping at the brewery.

Next Stop: Discovering the Old West in Historic Golden, Colorado



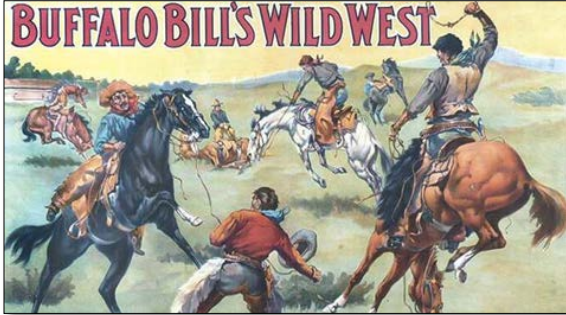
Here you'll find the flavor of the Old West with shopping, galleries, museums and eateries. Founded in 1859, Golden, Colorado is a historic former gold rush town nestled between North and South Table

Mountains and the always spectacular foothills of the Rocky Mountains, and when Colorado became a state in 1876, locals were outraged when Denver snagged the title of state capitol, but the loss of name distinction did nothing to slow Golden's growth.

The streets of historic downtown Golden are lined with an assortment of one-of-a-kind shops, galleries, recreation outfitters, music clubs, fine dining restaurants, distilleries, cafes and taverns.

Next stop: The Buffalo Bill Museum & Grave



This tour will take you into the foothills of the majestic Rocky Mountains. Born in 1846, William F. Cody experienced the Old West to its fullest. His skill as a buffalo hunter gained him the nickname "Buffalo Bill." Buffalo Bill's Wild West shows traveled the world leaving a lasting vision of the American West. The Museum illustrates the life, times, and legend of William F. Cody. It includes exhibits about Buffalo Bill's life and the Wild West shows, Indian artifacts and firearms. See Sitting Bull's bow and arrows, Buffalo Bill's

show outfits, Frederick Remington's "Portrait of a Ranch Hand," and many other objects from the Old West in the Buffalo Bill Museum and Grave.



A Grave with a View

Visit the one and only grave of William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody. Located in Lookout Mountain Park, part of the Denver Mountain Parks system, the site overlooks the natural beauty of the Great Plains and the Rockies, attracting over 400,000 annual visitors.
